### **Article 1**

(1) Article 4 is revoked and it is supplemented as follows:

The dissertation thesis must be a coherent work with the usual structure for publication in scientific magazines. The dissertation thesis must contain original and published results or results accepted for publication (Section 47(4) of the Act. The dissertation may take the form of an annotated set of at least 4 thematically related works of the PhD student published in magazines with an impact factor, provided with an introduction and a conclusion. The formatting of the work is governed by the respective University of Pardubice directive.

### **Article 2**

(1) Article 5 is revoked and it is supplemented as follows:

The minimum requirements for defence of the dissertation thesis is the student's co-authoring of 2 reviewed publications, of which at least one is published in a magazine with an impact factor. The student's contribution must be evident in both of these publications and the publications must contain the original results included in the dissertation thesis.

### **Article 13 Final Provisions**

- (1) Other provisions of the Directive No. 3/2017 shall remain unchanged.
- (2) This directive shall come into validity on the issue date.
- (3) This directive shall come into effect on 15<sup>th</sup> May 2023.
